HOW TO REPAIR A PITCHMARK



Take your ball mark repair tool and insert the prongs into the turf at the edge of the depression. Do NOT insert the prongs into the depression itself, but at the rim of the depression.

Then push the edge of the ball mark toward the centre, using your ball mark repair tool in a gentle twisting motion.

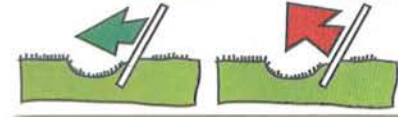
! This is where golfers who try to repair ball marks usually mess up. Many golfers believe the way to fix a ball mark is to insert the tool at an angle, so the prongs are beneath the centre of the crater, and then to use the tool as a lever to push the bottom of the ball mark back up even with the surface. Do not do this!

Pushing the bottom of the depression upward only tears the roots, and kills the grass.

Did you Know?

The average number of ball marks made on greens per round is 8 per golfer. Assuming only 130 rounds are played each day on your course, your greens receive 1,040 impressions daily, 30,000 per month or more than 334,400 per year. Are you wondering how to make A putt under these conditions?

LOCAL RULES

1. OUT OF BOUNDS (Rule 27-1)

- Beyond any hedge, fence, stream or white posts bounding the course
- Within the fence or white stakes defining the driving range or Par 3 course
- Beyond the white posts to the left of and to the rear of the 10th hole
- Beyond the white posts on the mound to the left of the 11th hole
- Beyond the white posts on the left when playing the 12th hole. This OOB extends to the white posts on the mound beside the 17th green and 16th tee.
- Beyond the white posts to the right and left of and to the rear of the 18th hole

2. WATER HAZARDS (Rule 26)

- Water hazards are defined by yellow stakes and/or lines. Lateral water hazards are defined by Red stakes and/or lines.
- When playing the 3rd hole if the ball rests in the water hazard beyond the Drop Zone to the left of the path a ball may be dropped in the Dropping Zone under penalty of one stroke.
 - When playing the 14th hole if the ball rests in the water hazard beyond the bridge to the right of the green a ball may be dropped in the Dropping Zone under penalty of one stroke.

3. GROUND UNDER REPAIR (Rule 25)

- Play is prohibited from all areas marked G.U.R. and bounded by white lines.
- A player must not play a ball from a 'wrong putting green' other than that of the hole being played. This includes aprons of all main greens and temporary greens.

4. STONES IN BUNKERS (Rule 24-1)

Stones in bunkers are movable obstructions.

5. PROTECTION OF YOUNG TREES (Rule 24-2)

If a tree or shrub that is staked or otherwise supported (eg spiral bound) interferes with the players stance or intended area of swing, the ball MUST be lifted, without penalty, and dropped in accordance with the procedure prescribed in Rule 24-2b.

6. IMMOVABLE OBSTRUCTIONS (Rule 24)

Immovable obstructions include sprinkler heads, manhole covers, all artificial pathways, 150 yard marker posts, fairway distance plates, ball washers, benches/seating and sign posts. Relief without penalty MAY be taken in accordance with the procedure prescribed in Rule 24-2b. When playing Hole 3 – a ball lying on the footpath to the left of the green may be dropped in the dropping zone. Red and yellow water hazard marker stakes MAY be removed and replaced if they interfere with the players stance or intended swing.

7. PYLONS & STRAINER WIRES

Are deemed to be integral parts of the course and the ball must be played as it lies or declared unplayable under rule 28.

8. OVERHEAD POWER CABLES

If a ball strikes a power cable the ball must be abandoned and the stroke MUST be retaken under no penalty.

9. DISTANCE MEASURING DEVICES (Rule 14-3)

The use of a measuring device capable of assessing distance only, including a distance meter attached to a golf cart, is permitted.

10. TEMPORARY LOCAL RULES

Any temporary local rule that is defined on the notice board and in the Pro Shop

PENALTY FOR BREACH OF A LOCAL RULE

Match Play – Loss of Hole;
 Stroke Play – Two strokes

FAIRWAY DISTANCE MARKERS

All distance markers are to the centre of the green.

HEALTH AND SAFETY

If the Klaxon sounds (two long notes) you must vacate the course immediately.

A player must always ensure that it is safe to play a shot, before doing so.
