From our <u>County to Captain</u> <u>Tracy Roberts</u>— single figure golfers are encouraged to join OLCGA squad training sessions. If pushing your golf further, connecting with like-minded individuals, and being considered for <u>competitive scratch matches</u> is for you, then please do get in touch.

An end of season squad session was held at Tadmarton Heath last month with more than a dozen players attending. We started with an in-door session meeting next season's Oxfordshire County Coach, Deana Rushworth (Witney Lakes). She gave us a flavour of what she has in store for us, and what we should be working on over the cold winter months (shortgame, lag putting drills, and scratch matchplay all incorporated into a Winter Order of Merit), before we all moved outside for a competitive fourball match played from the 2026 County Match Week tee positions. It was a good opportunity for Deana to get to know the players' games, and

to offer her expertise on approaching the holes.

We finished the day with small presentations to this season's Par 18 League prize winners (Lara Murphy, winner and Sarah Clarke, most improved), a squad league played in and out of squad sessions, which focused exclusively on short-game — interestingly, both players saw reductions in their playing handicaps during the season, suggesting the focus on short-game was worth the effort. We also awarded second team colours to Sarah Hillas (Henley GC) and Nikki Halsall (Kirtlington) for recording 6 match wins in the Midland

South 2nd Team County League.

This year's playing squad included several new and returning faces to County golf. They have all proved excellent additions throwing themselves into training sessions, competitions and matches.

Next season, we will have more new faces joining the squad, including a few talented county juniors, as well as one or two other single figure golfers. If you know of anyone else who deserves an invite (single figures), and would relish playing County golf, please do let me know.

Golf Events for All – county competitions run through the playing season and there is something for every single one of our golfing members whatever their age or ability.

We had a full and successful calendar of events for 2025. Congratulations to all winners, thank you to our host clubs, volunteers, helpers and to all of you who took part. If you want a reminder, you can read the news stories on our website.

The full set of 2026 dates for competitions and knockout finals will be released soon and will be visible on the <u>website</u> and your golf genius app. The draw for the knockouts will be announced at the AGM.

One key date to hold in your diary is the 2026 County Championship event which will be held over three days at The Wychwood GC. The Championships begin on 29th May with stroke play and are followed by match play knockout on the 30th and then finals on 31st May. There are three divisions: the main County Championship; the Mid-Silver Championship (handicaps from 12.5 to 20.5); and the Bronze Championship (handicaps from 20.6 to 35.5). These events will also incorporate the Junior and Senior Championships. We do ask that all clubs refrain from organizing their county Knockout matches on these three days to encourage as many golfers to take part as possible.

What's in a name?

We held an Extraordinary General Meeting on 6th October 2025 to vote on the Association changing its status to a Limited Company. The primary reason for this change is to protect the Officers from any litigation, and the secondary reason is to facilitate an easy transition should we decide to merge with another similar organisation. The vote in favour of the motion to change was unanimous, and we have instructed a solicitor to act on our behalf.

We now must consider what we call ourselves. The County Executive are unanimously in favour of changing the name to Oxfordshire Women's Golf Limited, but this will not be adopted until all members have had the opportunity to have their say. Nothing will be finalised without full consultation, and members are invited to feedback their views to any Officer, who will ensure that all input is considered before a decision is made.

The proposed change from "Ladies" to "Women" reflects a move towards modern, inclusive, and professional terminology. "Women" is the standard term used across sports and professional organisations, and it avoids the historical connotations of "Ladies," which can imply etiquette, fragility, or patronising expectations. Using "Women" recognises the skill, athleticism, and achievements of our members, aligns with contemporary practice in golf governance, and ensures our association remains welcoming and relevant to all female golfers. Most importantly, it reflects who our players are today: women who love the game, compete seriously and contribute to the vitality of our sport.

Oxon County Juniors

The Girls Summer Meeting was held at Shrivenham in July — we had 4 of the lower handicap signed up for the main comp and 4 of the Development group who played 9 holes, followed by a putting competition. Well done to the winners — Kirsty Soffe (Burford) won the 18 hole competition and Emma Cook (Henley) won the 9 hole event.

but I am very pleased to report that
Issy O'Neill (Drayton Park) won the
best net prize for the 36 holes, and
Sienna Fagen-Smith (Studley Wood)
was runner up in the 18 hole
stableford competition.

Turning to the Junior Academy, 2025 has been a successful year. We had 8 girls sign up for the Performance group this year, and 12 for the Development, of whom 7 are new to the Academy. This is a reflection of

the hard work done by Andy Taylor at Kirtlington in spreading the word to all the Juniors he coaches, and also by the clubs around the county to encourage girls to sign up.

The Development group has been so successful that a number of the girls are returning to play in the afternoons of the Performance group this Autumn, keeping the close knit group that has been formed by the girls from different clubs together until the Development Group sessions formally start again in April.
