- 3. Write to [local MP] and the Secretary of State for Housing, Communities, and Local Government to communicate this resolution and advocate for enhanced support for neighbourhood planning

Little Compton and Barton on the Heath Parish Councils have not responded to enquiry re combined Neighbourhood Plan and due to the withdrawal of Government funding Council decided not to progress.

Warwickshire Rural Housing Association had enquired if proceeding with a Housing Needs Survey and Council were interested in pursuing.

Cllr Lewis-Beeching suggested that an alternative might be a Parish Plan and matter to be researched for consideration at next meeting.

Cllr Lewis-Beeching reported that he had registered the nominated Little Wolford dark sky location on one of the recognised stargazing websites and the process for taking light measurements, etc. was in place. The Village Hall have also been contacted re consent for use of Hall grounds as registered site
